Off-Leash Area Rules for Use

Per the **Johnson County Code of Regulations for the Park & Recreation District:**
(Violations may result in citations and fines)

Section 2.1.3 (a) – dogs may only be allowed off leash while within the designated boundaries of OFF LEASH AREAS
(See map for the designated boundaries of this facility)

Section 2.1.3 (d) – Notwithstanding subsection (a) above, no dog shall be allowed off leash in an off-leash area in any District facility if said dog is known at any time to have bitten any person.

Code of Conduct

The following Code of Conduct has been established to provide for the safety of park patrons and their pets and for the protection of park resources:

(Violators may be required to leave the premises)

- Handlers must leash and/or remove their dog(s) from the off-leash area at the first sign of serious, unprovoked aggressive behavior
- Dogs must be under the control and in view of their handler at all times
- Handlers are limited to a maximum of three dogs in the off-leash area at a time
- Handlers must carry one leash for each dog
- Dogs with spiked collars must remain leashed at all times
- Dogs less than 12 weeks of age are not allowed in the area
- All dogs must have current vaccinations evidenced by visible tag(s)
- Female dogs in heat are not allowed in the area
- To help reduce the potential spread of parasites, handlers should pick-up and dispose of their dog's waste in the collection container provided
- Children less than 16 years of age must be under adult supervision while within the boundaries of the off-leash area
- Do not bring food into the area as some dogs can become aggressive or bite hands carrying food, especially the hands of children.

Assumption of Risk

To all those entering the off-leash designated boundaries, you are aware dogs are un-leashed and loose. Despite the best efforts of any dog owner/handler, a dog may act in an unpredictable manner. Dog owners/handlers are entirely responsible for their dog's actions and accept the risk of allowing their dog(s) to interact with people, other dogs, existing park and lake conditions, and District employees and vehicles in the performance of their duties. Owners are legally responsible for any injury caused by their dog(s).
